Sunday reflection from Fr Martin

Today's readings point us towards a greater hope and trust in God's presence and goodness.

In the first reading the prophet Jeremiah reminds us that God does not give up on us, even if we give up on him! He is reminding us of God's goodness, God's promise, God's covenant: 'Then I will be their God and they shall be my people.' It is this truth that calls us to a greater trust in God; do we really believe it?



In today's Gospel Jesus declares to his disciples that, 'the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified', meaning the time for his passion, death and resurrection is coming soon. His ministry of preaching and teaching and healing is drawing to a close, now he is to be put to the test. In this moment we see Jesus in the fulness of his humanity, his 'soul is troubled' and he is tempted to pray to be saved from this hour; yet 'it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour'. And so, Jesus too, is called to a greater trust in God, his loving Father. As followers of Jesus, we are called to trust in God, our loving Father, especially in the more difficult and dark times and experiences in life.

I think it is also worth reflecting on the beginning of today's Gospel which sets the scene for the words of Jesus. 'Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ... These approached Phillip ... and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus'.' During this Lent have we developed that same desire 'to see Jesus'? Have we grown closer to Jesus especially in our prayer, have we focused more on Jesus especially through our fasting and are we trying to imitate Jesus in his care for the most vulnerable through the generosity of our almsgiving? It is still not too late to keep trying!
